


Civil War Elementary School Teacher Instructions and Reproducible Activity

This activity includes a reproducible Kepi hat sheet. Students will write the name of either a Confederate or Union state on the hats, and then color the hats accordingly, either blue or grey. Once this is done, the hats can be displayed on the bulletin board, giving the students a visual reminder of which states were in the Union and which were in the Confederacy.

Supplies needed: Kepi hat worksheets, list of states, textbooks (or other available reference material), pens or markers (for writing the names of states), and grey and blue crayons or colored pencils

- 1. First, pass out the worksheets with the Kepi hats on them.
- 2. Have students write their names of the back of their hats.
- 3. Ask students to take out their list of Confederate and Union States (or provide them with a list).
- 4. Remind the students that blue Kepi hats represent the Union and grey Kepi hats represent the Confederacy.
- 5. Instruct the students to use a dark pen or black (or dark colored) marker to write the name of either a Union or Confederate State on their hats and then color the hats accordingly.
- 6. Next, display the hats on the bulletin board.
